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The Michigan Radiation Oncology Quality Consortium (MROQCC) is a collaborative group of specialists across the state of Michigan working together on quality improvement projects to impact the radiation treatment experience for patients.

MROQCC's goal is to find ways to minimize the side effects that patients may experience from radiation treatment. To do this, we are linking together information about how radiation therapy is delivered with information provided by treating clinicians about patient outcomes, and information from the patient regarding side effects that occur during treatment.

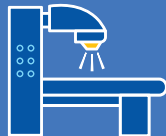
We believe that by doing this, we will be able to identify better ways of matching treatment plans to each patient's unique characteristics to minimize the side effects that will be experienced.

We invite you to take part in this important quality improvement project evaluating the outcomes that patients experience with different types of radiation treatment. The knowledge gained through MROQCC will be used to improve the quality of care delivered to cancer patients in the future.

We are asking people like you, who are being treated for cancer at radiation oncology facilities across the state of Michigan, to complete surveys that capture the side-effects you may be experiencing. There are different time points when we will ask you to complete these surveys: before treatment begins, at the end of treatment, and after treatment has ended (during your follow up visits).

Your participation in this quality improvement initiative is entirely voluntary and will not in any way affect the treatment you receive. If you have any questions about MROQCC, please feel free to discuss them with your Radiation Oncologist.
